
### **Basic Guidelines**

- After your group has chosen your idioms, let me (your teacher) know. If possible, I want each group to have different idioms.


### PowerPoint Guidelines

  - Fluency: How easily does the student respond?
  - **Pronunciation**: How easy is it to understand the student when he/she talks?
  - **Vocabulary**: Does the student use appropriate vocabulary?
  - **Grammar & Structure**: Does the student use appropriate grammar according to his/her level?
