#### **Course Description:**

This course is intended for advanced level students to improve their English communication skills and to prepare them for college or vocational institutions. All language skills – listening, speaking, reading, and writing – will be integrated in communicative, meaningful, and content-oriented lessons. Students will participate in presentations, discussions, group projects, quizzes, computer lab visits, homework, and exams to ensure life-long learning, civic participation, and academic/career success.

#### Required Course Textbook (Students must buy):

Mauer, J. (2012). Focus on Grammar 5: An Integrated Skills Approach. (4<sup>th</sup> Edition). You can purchase the course textbook at the Mt.SAC bookstore in Building 9A.

#### **Class Materials:**

Please bring a notebook (for notes and English vocabulary), folder/binder, pens, pencils, and an English dictionary to every class. It is highly recommended that you buy a USB flash drive so that you can save any of the work you do in the computer lab.

#### Attendance:

It is important that you attend every class and that you come to class on time. If you miss more than 4 consecutive classes and/or 26 hours of class, you will be dropped from the class. Remember that when you are late to class, the time you miss counts against you.

Please let me know in advance if you are going to be absent, late, or leave early from class. You can tell me in class, send me an email, or leave a voicemail. For emails and voicemail messages, please mention your name, the date of the class, and the reason for your absence.

#### How to successfully pass level 6:

To pass level 6, you must:

#### **Evaluation**

- 1. Attendance: See attendance section.
- 2. Participation: Each week you can earn up to 20 participation points (5 points per class session) by attending class, paying attention, and playing an active role in class.
- 3. *Homework:* After completing each unit in the textbook, you will be given a grammar packet. I will give you the packets in class. These packets are worth 10 points each. If you do not complete the homework by the due date, you will not receive credit.
- 4. Tests:
- a. Grammar Quizzes specific dates will be announced in class
- b. Midterm Exam: Tuesday, October 18 (Week 8)
- c. Final Exam: Tuesday, December 13 (Week 16)
- 5. *Writing Samples:* All writing samples will be written in class. There are no make-ups for writing samples. Each student will be responsible for writing the following:
  - a. Narrative: You will write a story about an experience from your past.
  - b. Interview: You will interview a classmate about his/her life and write a summary.
  - c. Review: You will write about your opinion of a movie, restaurant, etc.

- 6. *Idiom Group Presentation:* Each student, in a small group, is responsible for creating and presenting a PowerPoint of English idioms. Each student is responsible for presenting at least two idioms. Presentations will begin week 4. In your presentation, you can use a conversation, pictures, or videos to explain the idioms' meaning and use(s). Please sign- up for a date and time on the "Idiom Presentation" sheet.
- 7. EL Civics Project: Career Paths (SLO): Students will complete a chart comparing categories of job information using the Internet. In addition, students will present via PowerPoint, the research results of an identified career path using multiple resources (interview, books, Internet, magazines, newspapers, etc.). A passing score is 36 out of 40 points.


